Every college, university, and K-12 district is also confronted with compliance issues generated by multiple federal statutes, including the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), the Individuals with Disabilities in Education Act, and the Clery Act. Our skilled education law attorneys provide guidance to administrators to ensure that their school’s practices and procedures conform to all applicable laws and regulations.

Our attorneys are also adept at assisting our clients with Title IX compliance, including the rules promulgated by the U.S. Department of Education that became effective in August 2020. The U.S. Department of Education set forth proposed rules in June 2022 that would alter the current Title IX process; those rules are not yet effective, but we are monitoring them closely and anticipate they may go into effect before the 2023-2024 school year. We’re here to educate our clients regarding the rules and assist with policy formation and the training of decision makers and investigators. Critchfield attorneys are also available to serve as Title IX investigators, hearing officers, and hearing advisors, in addition to providing representation to our school clients in any Title IX-related litigation.
